REQUEST TO THE RCM OF ARGENTEUIL TO MODIFY THE USAGE CODE FOR LIT 5 318 443

REQUEST FOR MINOR DEROGATION NO 2021-25: 86, SAHARA STREET, LOT 5 317 505

WHEREAS a request for a minor derogation was received concerning lot 5 317 505 in order to allow for the construction of a house at a distance of 7 m from the front property line instead of at a distance of 20 m as well as to allow the house to be built at a distance of 7 m from the side line instead of at distance of 10 m, as required for zone VI-16;

WHEREAS the Planning Advisory Committee met in order to study this request. It was found that in this area, a few similar derogations have been awarded due to the topography of the lots. The steep slope of the land that drops off towards the lake sometimes makes the front setback margin difficult to maintain without having a negative impact on the trees and land. After discussion, the CCU members recommend that the minor derogation request be accepted with the condition that a vegetation screen be planted and maintained between the house and the road so as to minimize the visibility of the house from said road.

REQUEST FOR MINOR DEROGATION NO 2021-361: 18 IRLANDAIS STREET, LOT 6 049 196

The original permit was based on a house with grey siding and a red roof, however the owner modified the color for a yellow siding with red roof. RESOLUTION REGARDING BILL 103, AN ACT TO AMEND VARIOUS LEGISLATIVE PROVISIONS MAINLY FOR THE PURPOSES OF REDUCING THE ADMINISTRATIVE BURDEN

WHEREAS Bill 103, An Act to amend various legislative provisions mainly for the purposes of reducing the administrative burden, is currently under detailed study by the Parliamentary Committee on the Economy and Labor;

WHEREAS article 75 of this bill amends article 65.1 of the Law on the protection of land and agricultural activities so a request for the exclusion of a lot from the agricultural zone and the demonstration as to the non-availability of an appropriate space for the intended purposes would be made at a regional level and longer at a municipal (local) level;

WHEREAS it is important to ensure the sustainability of the agricultural zone and the development of agricultural activity;

WHEREAS this objective of increasing agricultural production in order to develop the regions cannot be achieved without viable and healthy communities and villages;

WHEREAS there is an impact arising from this proposal on the development of rural areas where the challenges of urban sprawl are not the same as near large centers;

WHEREAS the vitality of village cores in rural and regional areas cannot be approached in the same way as the problems of growth in urban areas in large agglomerations;

WHEREAS several city centers have, in the past, obtained significant de zoning allowances which often exceeded their real needs, which has contributed to the loss of agricultural land and to urban sprawl;

WHEREAS the adoption of Article 75 risks having the effect of concentrating development in central cities, to the detriment of village cores;

WHEREAS there is a significant impact for a large number of villages and communities in regions of Quebec that are not affected by the problems of urban sprawl;

WHEREAS the adoption of a unique approach to land management such as that contained in article 75 goes against the government's discourse on the need to take into account regional particularities and strengthen the land use planning process, in particular within the framework of future national policy on architecture and regional planning;

WHEREAS the FQM asked a parliamentary committee on Tuesday, November 2, 2021 to maintain the power to request exclusion from local municipalities and to strengthen the current planning process to ensure the coherence of the planned development of the territory as desired by the legislator and the current government.
