

### A WORD FROM THE MAYOR

It would be difficult not to address the intermunicipal agreement for the provision of professional fire safety protection services project. This topic is of great concern to our population and much has been said on social media in recent weeks. There are some important facts to remember when trying to understand the decisions made by the municipal council.

Here are attendance rates for Gore firefighters in 2024:



In 2024, only 5 out of 27 firefighters were present at more than 50% of calls. This is unsustainable. This is not a criticism of our firefighters—we appreciate them enormously—it's the reality of life in rural areas today. Most firefighters work outside the municipality, often with young families and work commitments. It's very difficult for them to always be present in the area and available to respond.

In fact, the 2024 figures reflect the reality we've been experiencing for several years. The municipality has been working since 2023 to find sustainable solutions to ensure its residents are adequately covered in terms of fire safety. This is not a task the municipality has taken lightly or rushed into, as has been mentioned on some platforms.

On the municipality's website (<u>www.cantondegore.qc.ca/en/publications/intermunicipal-agreement-fire-safety-services</u>), you will find the background behind this approach.

There is also a lot of inaccurate information currently circulating on social media, and I want to set the record straight:

- All the equipment and firefighters needed for the Gore Fire Department remain in Gore. The fire station remains open and operational. We are not losing our service.
- Why sign an agreement with Lachute? Because Lachute has firefighters on duty internally (in the fire station) and a command staff composed of several managers—which allows for an officer on duty 24/7 instead of only one fire chief being responsible 24/7, 365 days a year. Lachute firefighters are in the fire truck within 90 seconds of receiving a call, and, after several tests, the transport time between the Lachute fire station and the Gore fire station is 12 minutes for a fire truck.
- Is the council negotiating this agreement because of the unionization of firefighters? Not at all—the council has been looking for solutions for a long time, and negotiations with the City of Lachute began well before the city was informed of the unionization (which took place in February 2025).

The municipality's sole goal is to find a way to improve our service and better protect our citizens.

# A LOOK BACK AT THE INVASIVE SPECIES CONFERENCE

On June 21st, a captivating conference on Invasives Species was held at the Gore Community Center. The event aimed toward better understanding the challenges linked to these species, to provide tools to Citizens in order to prevent their introduction, and to learn to detect them, understand how they propagate and know when and how to intervene.

The Guest Speaker, Mathieu Madison (Biologist / Environmentalist) invited by the Alliance of Gore Lake Associations, offered a clear, documented and highly appreciated presentation. Over 50 participants attended, showing the growing interest about this problematic issue. Numerous pertinent questions and rich sharing animated the discussion.

Mathieu Madison recommends a systemic approach, i.e. he takes into account the overall ecosystem where the different species evolve instead of focusing and acting on a species in particular.

The Eurasian Milfoil is THE aquatic exotic species that we need to prevent from spreading. Surveillance and detection are the first steps to take.

This meeting shows the growing synergy between the lake associations in Gore and a collective desire to better understand the preventive actions.

We thank the Township of Gore for offering us the community center space.

### **Exotic species present in Gore:**

### Chinese Mystery Snall (Cipangopaludina chinensis)

Small freshwater snail with a greenishbrown spiral shell, reaching up to 5 cm in length. It inhabits several lakes in the Laurentians, particularly in the Argenteuil RCM. This species competes with native molliusks for the same food resources, thereby disrupting the balance of local aquatic ecosystems.

### Japanese Knotweed (Fallopia japonica)

Plant with thick stems and heart-shaped leaves, it grows in dense masses along roadsides and riverbanks. Highly invasive, it smothers local vegetation and can damage structures. Found widely throughout the Laurentians.

### Red-eared Slider (Trachemys scripta elegans)

lakes and rivers, particularly in areas like Deux-Montagnes and Tremblant, depriving native

aquatic vegetation of sunlight and obstructing

Identified by a bright red patch behind each eye, this turtle is often released by pet owners. It establishes itself in ponds and lakes near urban areas, where it competes with native turtles and can disrupt local wildlife populations.

### Common Reed (Phragmites australis)

This reed, which can grow up to 4 meters tall, colonizes marshes and ditches, notably in Mirabel, Sainte-Agathe, and even Gore. It forms very dense stands that reduce biodiversity and alter the functioning of wetlands.

### Garlic Mustard (Alliaria petiolata)

Herbaceous plant found in understories and along traits, recognizable by its heart-shaped leaves and white four-petaled flowers. It releases toxic chemicals that inhibit the growth of other plants, altering the plant composition of forests around Mont-Tremblant and Saint-Sauveur.



(Frangula alnus) (Rhamnus cathartica)

Bucktho

These shrubs, ranging from 3 to 6 meters tall, quickly colonize woodlands and hedgerows, notably in Mirabel and Lachute. Their dense growth prevents the regeneration of native species, thereby altering natural habitats.

# BOAT WASHING STATIONS IN GORE

To preserve our waterways and lakes, Gore has installed two self-service boat wash stations in the area. They are available at the following locations:

**Municipal Park** – 45 Cambria Road (chalet building)

**Beattie Lake Nature Park** – 501 Beattie Road (for park users)

It is important to wash all your boats before launching them in Gore. This is the most effective way to prevent the spread of Eurasian Watermilfoil (among other things).



### THE TRÉSORS DU DÔME

Have you visited the Dome lately? Les Trésors du Dôme is located on the same property as the Ecocentre (40 Sideline Road) and you are entitled to unlimited visits.



Les Trésors du Dôme is a resource center that collects items in good condition to resell them at low prices. You can come and donate your items and make low-cost purchases.

During the summer season (until Thanksgiving), the Dome is open Wednesdays, Saturdays, and Sundays from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

All funds raised are donated within the three participating municipalities: Gore, Wentworth, and Mille-Isles.

To help pollinating insects (including our friends the bees) and to prevent the area from becoming abandoned, the municipality has planted bee-friendly flowers.

# INSTALLATION OF EDUCATIONAL RADARS

Six educational radars have been installed at strategic locations throughout the territory. Other radars will be installed in the coming years, which we hope will improve



road safety by encouraging motorists to drive more slowly on our roads. These radars record the speeds of all users. The statistics will be shared with the Sûreté du Québec to help them target problem areas in the municipality and thus be able to act more effectively on our territory.

### **PUBLIC WORKS**


As you know, a heavy rainfall event occurred in Gore on Sunday, July 13<sup>th</sup>. This event had significant (and disastrous) consequences on our roads. The road crew was able to quickly restore traffic on Brown Road; however, two roads remain closed for the time being.

- 1- Barron Lake Road is closed to traffic between civic numbers 20 and 27. Significant subsidence of the road requires extensive work at this location. The work will take place during the summer, but engineering plans are required as we want to consider climate change in the design and ensure the construction of resilient infrastructure.
- 2- **Kerr Road** is closed past the farm to Hughes Lake Road due to major shoulder erosion and a dangerous culvert. The work will be carried out over the next few weeks.

### KERR FARM: ITS HISTORY AND LEGACY

As you probably know, Kerr Farm is a historic site that has held great sentimental value for many years. The Kerr family was one of the first 200 families to settle in our small township in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century, in 1833.

### Amos Kerr, a pioneer for the resort industry

While the region was experiencing a marked decline due to rural exodus (in the 1930s), he had the visionary idea of creating a place where visitors could enjoy an authentic Canadian farm experience. He attracted visitors from Europe,



Canada, and the United States. Determined, he even picked them up at the Lachute train station using a Bombardier B12 skidoo as a taxi. From 1930 until the 1980s, Kerr farm offered tourists a wilderness experience. The site included worker housing, a gas station, a mechanic's garage, a tennis court, an inn, a beach, and farm activities.

### A Rich History

Between Amos Kerr's time and today, the site has served several purposes: a bed and breakfast, a rehabilitation center, a shelter for people with disabilities, and more. In March 2020, Steve Vachon became the owner of this once-community space, precisely four days before the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. Despite this difficult context, Steve was committed to restoring this festive, family-oriented, and unifying place to its former glory.

After more than a decade of neglect, the work was colossal: renovating the reception hall's parquet flooring, restoring the rooms, and, above all, revitalizing the site's spirit. An entrepreneur in the microgreens sector and former owner of a bistro in Montreal, Steve firmly believed in the potential of Kerr Farm to bring the Canton community together again.

Steve dreamed of a peaceful, communal space conducive to wonderful human encounters. Although fraught with challenges and a rollercoaster of emotions, he persevered. With the support and help of his father, he poured a lot of love into restoring the place to a welcoming state, especially by restoring its historic character.

After more than two and a half years of hard work, Kerr farm reopened its doors in the fall of 2022 for its first event: an intimate and joyful wedding, the perfect symbol of this rebirth.

Kerr farm has once again become a vacation spot where it's good to live and celebrate. Weddings, birthdays, life celebrations.

Steve loves seeing the smiles and moments of joy that take place there: "It's fun to see happy people at home; it's magical". The latter also wanted to find a way to open the doors and welcome citizens into a collective, cultural, and community offering to allow this legendary place to be reborn, true to the village spirit that Amos Kerr had established.

The name "La Ferme Kerr" was retained in honor of Mr. Amos Kerr; Steve wholeheartedly wanted to honor this man's vision. During a meeting with Mrs. Margaret Kerr, wife of Mr. Harvey

Kerr, he asked her permission to keep the original name. So touched and honored by the gesture, she gladly accepted, leaving him a painting featuring the famous red barn.

### **Cultural Programming: A Legacy for the Community**

Still with the genuine desire to revive the site and allow citizens to enjoy the space, the idea of creating the non-profit organization Héritage Ferme Kerr was born. Inspired by Mr. Kerr, Steve launched several flagship activities:

- Mardi Rire Gras: a French-language comedy cabaret hosted by Joe Guérin and an English-language cabaret hosted by Rachelle Elie. Every Tuesday during the summer, the barn transforms into a comedy club where 80 people laugh together while discovering comedians.
- The Curiosity Market: this unique public market combines art, culture, and agriculture. Since summer 2024, the market has been held every Thursday from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m., on a charming site, and is already one of the largest markets in the Laurentians. The market will continue until September 11.

These events would not be possible without the commitment of the citizens and volunteers who participate.

### The Future of Kerr farm

Steve dreamed of a place where his family could thrive. When he thinks about how far he's come since March 2020, he's thrilled and moved by the environment in which his son, little Ary, will grow up. He's convinced that the pioneers of this place would be proud of the revival of this unifying space. Thanks to Steve's boldness, passion, confidence, tenacity, and undoubtedly his vision, Héritage Ferme Kerr now provides a rich cultural and community offering that, above all, is faithful to the original spirit of this historic site.

### **Héritage Ferme Kerr**

The organization's mission is to:

- Perpetuate the historical legacy of the site
- Revalue local heritage
- Promote a human and collective approach
- Offer socio-cultural events accessible to all
- Ensure the sustainability of these offerings for the population
- Offer an alternative and intergenerational educational component
- Promote the territory and strengthen ties between citizens and neighbors
- Promote collective and community values

Marie-Josée Gagné, a proud resident of our small township for almost two years, fell in love with our village. Working remotely, she and her partner were able to realize their dream of settling near Evans Lake.

Marie-Josée quickly integrated into the community by volunteering her time at various municipal events. She also holds a new role on the board of directors of the Kerr Farm Heritage organization.

A sense of belonging emerged naturally, fueled by the community spirit and the desire to offer local mushroom production. Every Thursday, until September 11, find La Ferme à Champis at the Kerr Farm's Market of Curiosities, which offers you the perfect opportunity to meet Marie-Josée and discover her mushrooms. Grown right here in Gore.

Mushroom farming is ecological, economical, and profitable. But above all, it's a rewarding and stimulating activity that fosters encounters with local residents.

La Ferme à Champis produces mushrooms year-round: you can purchase mushrooms from Marie-Josée 365 days a year. In just 6 months, she's already been supplying her products to the Herbes chouettes farm shop <a href="https://herbeschouettes.ca/collections">https://herbeschouettes.ca/collections</a> located in Lachute. Marie-Josée hopes to partner with local restaurateurs and farmers to develop the idea of growing mushrooms in

various locations in the region, always with the goal of promoting local production.

As a communications and human relations trainer, she also plans to develop workshops to share her passion and make mushroom farming accessible to all.

Long live La Ferme à Champis! Bravo Marie-Josée for daring to foster this wonderful passion for mushrooms.

### A CHOIR IS BORN

Last fall (2024), a choir workshop was born in Gore, bringing together nearly fifteen people from the community and surrounding areas: English and French; proof that music knows no language barriers.

They presented their first Christmas show last December (2024) and joined singers from the Sainte-Adèle choir workshop to deliver a magnificent unison concert. It's incredible what vocal coach **Audrey Nobili** managed to create in less than three months!

A second show was presented last June (2025), in front of more than 110 people at the **Lakefield Cultural Space**. They were even invited to sing Gilles Vigneault's anthem, Gens du pays, at the Saint-Jean-Baptiste celebration in Sainte-Adèle.

Audrey Nobili played a big part in this. In the spring of 2024, we invited her to lead three pop-up choir events. We observed a real interest from the public, and the idea of creating choir workshops in Gore naturally emerged.

### Who is Audrey Nobili?

Audrey settled with her family in the Laurentians in 2017, after coming here on vacation two years earlier. Originally from Marseille, France, after working for nine years in the microelectronics field, she began a career change, completed a three-year training course at the Richard Cross School, and became a certified Vocal Trainer in Amplified Contemporary Music. This amateur singer, who sang in pop-rock bands, began teaching singing and directing pop choirs.

It's clear to Audrey: singing and music are an integral part of her life. She loves creating choirs, harmonizing voices, and developing each individual's talent. She firmly believes that anyone can sing; they just need to learn a few simple techniques and they're ready to go. She loves the human touch this profession brings. It's moving to see people come together and sing together.

Audrey now directs three choirs in the Laurentians. The "A Phil Good" choir, born from the organization APHIL - Association of People with Intellectual Disabilities of the Laurentians (APHIL For a More Inclusive World), is a choir that is particularly close to her heart. She also directs **the Gore choir**, as well as the Sainte-Adèle choir; and soon the St-Hippolyte choir will be born. Voices can be heard rising up all over the Laurentians.

Audrey also offers vocal coaching for those who wish to further explore their voice.

A concert group will soon be formed to travel the region and offer performances in residences, organizations, and Christmas markets. In September, Audrey will consolidate all her singing activities under the project name "Together in Choir." Her mission? To spread joy, happiness, peace, and unity by bringing communities together through song.

The Gore choir workshops resume September 10<sup>th</sup> with weekly Wednesday evening meetings. The group is always looking for new singers who would like to join the group; it's a great activity for families, especially teenagers!






